# A change of arrangements for booking a place at weekend masses during August

The change now is: For a guaranteed seat at any of our Sunday Masses you will still need to book in advance for the remainder of August, up until 12 noon on the Thursday before that Mass takes place. However, you can now turn up for Sunday Masses on the day for a 'first come, first served basis'.

Sundays remain very full, particularly at Annunciation Church, but there are the odd cancellations. You will need to **arrive at least 10 minutes before mass starts,** and be prepared to wait for vacancies /cancellations.

# Booking arrangements for weekend Masses during September.

Firstly, inventing a booking a system from scratch for weekend masses is not something I would ever have ever expected to do in my time as a priest, let alone during my first year as a new Parish Priest. It has pretty much been a trial and error approach and extremely time consuming with little guidance from the Diocese. So it has been a trial and error approach as we discover a system that works best for our two parishes here.

As we move into September I am going to trial a new system which will require you to book at place at Mass via the Parish website. This will enable you to book a place at a weekend Mass up until noon of the Thursday before that Mass is due to take place. All you need to do is go to the Parish Website, click on the link 'Booking a place at Mass' and it will take you through to a site where you can book a place at any of our Sunday Masses for September providing you leave your contact details and the details of those in your household you may be booking for. This booking system will go live on the 21st August.

If you don't have internet access or someone who can book for you on-line or are in a household of over five people, then you will need to telephone or email the Parish Office and let us know which Mass it is you want to attend and the names of those wishing to attend from your household. We will book you in centrally from here providing there are still places available.

For a guaranteed seat at any of our Sunday Masses you will still need to book in advance for September, up until 12 noon on the Thursday before that Mass takes place using the Parish Website. However, you can still turn up for Sunday Masses on the day for a 'first come, first served basis'. Sundays will remain very full, particularly at Annunciation Church, but there are the odd

cancellations. You will need to arrive at least 10 minutes before mass starts, and be prepared to wait for vacancies /cancellations.

All this will again be a trial and error approach and we will see how it goes. For weekday Masses there is currently no need to book.

I want to personally say a huge thank you to all those involved with the reopening of both our parish churches and responded to my call for help in doing this. The truth is we would not be having any public masses if these people had not stepped forward to help with the organization of it all. Huge amounts of work have gone on behind the scenes to do this, from rearranging the churches, completing risk assessments, training stewards up, organizing rotas etc etc. Thank you! We still need more volunteers stepping up to the plate to help with this. Please let me know if you are able to help with this.

## Fr Ross writes...

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, one of those unique Catholic celebrations which is not shared with our Protestant Christian brethren. Although the Assumption was only defined in the official teaching of the Church in 1950 by Pope Pius XII, it's origins and traditions go right back to the days of the Early Church.

What the Assumption celebrates is the truth that at the end of her earthly life Mary was taken up into heaven body and soul, and 'exulted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death (CCC 966).

It has been an ancient tradition from the Early Church that all of the Apostles except Thomas were present at the end of Mary's life here on earth. The continued mystery is that we don't know if Mary died first and then was assumed body and soul into heaven, or was she taken up into heaven like Elijah was in a whirlwind? The tradition is skant on detail, but the Eastern Church calls this Solemnity the falling asleep of Mary.

The Western Church favours Mary actually dying, just as her son Jesus died and that it was at the moment of her death that she was assumed into heaven. Mary became in the end the Resurrection of her Son, so her assumption could be called an arrival.

Mary we know had a life like ours, she was in the nitty gritty of the everyday as we are. Her life was sometimes full of light and hope and at other times her life was full of pain, suffering and darkness.

So what does this mean for us as Christians today? Well, the assumption of the Blessed virgin Mary into heaven confirms for us, just as Christ's resurrection did, that death is not the end but a new beginning. Jesus triumphed over death and opened the Kingdom of heaven to all believers – so it should be no surprise to us that Jesus' mother, immaculately conceived into the world should also be assumed into the heavenly realm.

As Catholic's we often ask to Mary to interceed on our behalf with the understanding that every good son always listens to his mother. Jesus' first miracle was turning water into wine at the wedding feast in Canaan after Mary's appeal for action. Jesus listened to his mother and acted, it continues to be the same today. Jesus listens to his Mother, so if we find we are not getting any answer to prayer, why not ask Mary for her help and intercessions and a nudging of her Son in the right direction.



# Resumption of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

I hope to be able to offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) at the usual published times from Friday 14<sup>th</sup> August (weather permitting). Since neither Church has a proper Confessional with a secure screen and separate entrance and exit points for both priest and penitent, I will have to hear confessions outside in the grounds of the Church with a temporary screen in place. I hope to restore the original confessional in St Patrick's Church before the end of summer.

# St Patrick's Accounts

It was my intention to publish the accounts for St Patrick's Church during Lent this year and for John Sowerby (Chair of our Joint Parishes Finance Committee) to give a talk and explanation of them at the end of each of our weekend Masses. Unfortunately, lockdown put an end to this, so we publish them below in a very simplistic manner for ease of reading. The full published version will be emailed out with this newsletter as an attachment and can be obtained from the Parish Office upon request for those who access the newsletter via the parish website.

What becomes clear is that the costs of running St Patrick's are far greater than the Offertory income (the 1st collection), which is meant to finance the Parish. If we allow for Annunciation's contribution (£9250, which is increasing to £15,888) and remove expenditure on the Hall (which pays for itself), last financial year St Patrick's expenses came to £87,929, giving day-to-day running costs of £1691 per week, but we only received £529 in the Offertory. Luckily much of that was gift aided: if all the Planned Giving, £330 per week, was gift aided this part would increase to £412, plus £199 in Other Offertory Income – on which we can also claim Income Tax – but we would still need to find more than £1000 per week extra.

Fund raising together with income from the Hall do help; unfortunately, we may get little or no income from the Hall this year, and may even have to subsidise it.

Can you help? If you pay Income Tax, you can gift aid your Offertory and thus each £1 that you donate becomes £1.25; you can contact Irene Chapman or the Parish Office for a form. Can you increase your Offertory contribution? At the end of the full published financial report attached to the newsletter you will find an explanation of the Parish's monthly and weekly per capita costs, and how they are calculated.

So in summary the costs last year involved to enable you to be present at St Patricks Church was £10.07 per week per person based on the average weekend Mass attendance of 168 adults. Your average collection per person was £3.15. As you can see this is a shortfall of £6.92 each visit (More if you do not come!) Please can you support your parish by increasing your contribution and attaching gift aid to your giving as this net's us another 25% from the chancellor's pocket! Gift Aid and Bank Forms available from the office or Irene Chapman.

The problem for us at St Patrick's is that although we are not a business enterprise that seeks to make a profit, running at a loss as we currently do each year clearly inhibits our ability to function properly as the Catholic Church serving the parish of Woolston. The stark reality is that if you want a thriving local parish church you need to support it, not only financially through the collection and fund raising activities but by volunteering to help the Church grow with your time and talents. More on this as the weeks pass.



# **Support of the Church**

Our two churches like other charitable institutions are losing vital income at this time through the loss of revenue from our weekly collections, hall bookings and fundraising activities now that the churches are closed.

St Patrick's Church has been particularly hard hit by this and is currently loosing around 60% of its monthly income via the plate collection, hall hire and other fund raising activities. St Patrick's outgoings are still higher than what we have coming in via Standing Orders as we still have to pay our monthly loan repayments to the diocese (one for the tower repairs and one for a historic loan taken out some years ago) and we also have to pay the dreaded Diocesan Levy, which currently is set at 25% of our yearly income based on last year's total income to the parish. So we are as a result getting ourselves more and more into debt by around £1400 per month. We are of course not the only parish church or charity to be in this situation, but I want you to be aware of this issue as we move to have the St Patrick's Parish Accounts published later in the year.

A huge thank you to those who recently signed up to give via Standing Order to our two parishes and also to those who have increased their giving via Standing Order, it really is greatly appreciated. If you currently give cash via the collection plate in church and are still in a position to do so, why not consider giving by Standing Order on a weekly or monthly basis. This is now very easy to do if you have Internet Banking or a Banking App on your smart phone.

Please do remember the Church financially during these difficult times if you are able to. Cheques to the parish office are also an option, but state clearly what they are for on the back and use the payee details below.

### **SETTING UP A STANDING ORDER**

To set up a standing order you will need the following account details depending on which Church you wish to contribute to and also for what purpose; so the reference is important.

You must put your name followed by **COLLECTION** (for your usual weekly collection), **SECOND COLLECTION** for the second collection as stated in the newsletter followed by which second collection eg CAFOD, or **DONATION** (to make a one off Donation).
